The Northwest Health Alliance (NWAHA) has been assisting three sites through the ConnectingOntario NER ClinicalViewer onboarding process and is excited with the progress that has been made this past month. Those three sites include the NorWest Community Health Centre, Anishnawbe Mushkiki Aboriginal Health Access Centre, and the Thunder Bay District Health Unit.

The NWAHA is pleased to report that the **NorWest Community Health Centre** has completed Go-Live Confirmation as of June 5, 2018. Congratulations on Go-Live! Over the next several weeks, the NWAHA will be collecting user feedback of the ClinicalViewer to share with other potential view only health service providers.

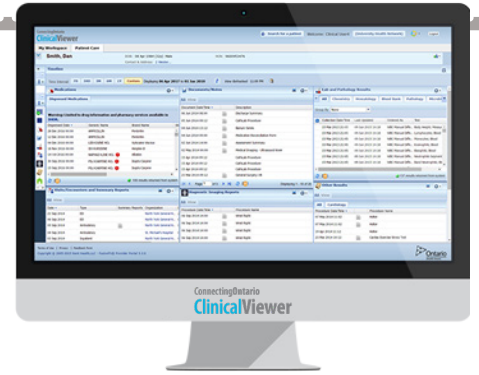
Anishnawbe Mushkiki Aboriginal Health Access Centre is in the final stages of Adoption with their Go-Live scheduled for month end.

The **Thunder Bay District Health Unit** has held their initial Privacy session with the NWAHA and will continue moving forward with adoption activities in anticipation of Go-Live later this fall. Lawrence Badanai (Privacy & Communications Officer, NWAHA) has taken on the role of privacy for the program and will be assisting all the view-only health service providers with their privacy obligations for the ConnectingOntario NER program.

The long-term care sector in our region is also currently being engaged and discussions with **Hogarth Riverview Manor** continue. The ClinicalViewer will provide great value to this next group of clinicians as they will gain timely and secure access to patient information including OLIS, Drug Repository, Hospital Documents and LHIN-HCC Reports, and more!

The NWAHA is reaching out to health service providers to the west of Thunder Bay and are hoping to identify and support another **aboriginal health access centre (AHAC)** with adoption activities over the summer.

The NWAHA ConnectingOntario team welcomed **Julies Stachiw** earlier this month as our new Clinical Change Management & Engagement Coordinator for the program. Julie is a Registered Dietitian who graduated from the University of Guelph with a Bachelor of Applied Science in 2011, at which point she undertook a dietetic internship with the Northern Ontario Dietetic Internship Program. 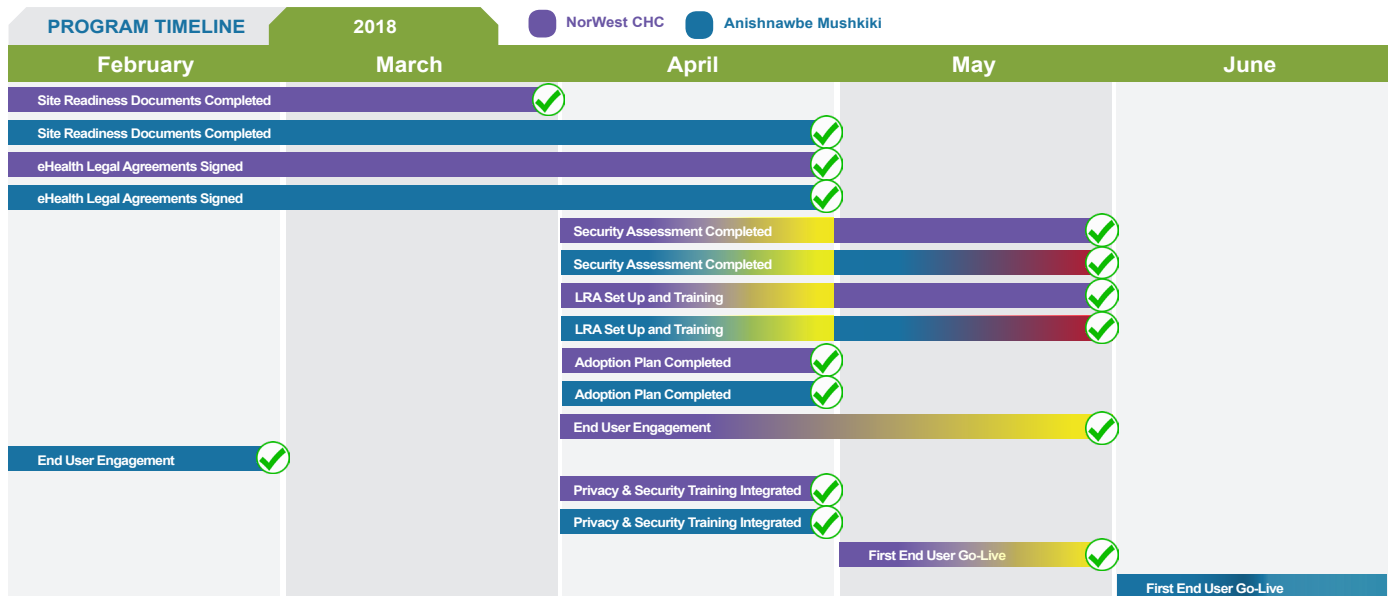
