Adoption Activities

The NorWest Community Health Centre (CHC) clinicians in Longlac will soon be joining the NorWest CHC clinicians at the Thunder Bay location and anticipate Clinical Viewer availability by the end of December 2018.

Currently the Thunder Bay Districts Health Unit is getting back to work on completing their Privacy and Security Assessments. This work was previously on hold due to strike action within their organization. In addition, they have received training materials in anticipation of their go-

Two St. Joseph's Care Group Long-Term Care (LTC) facilities; Bethammi and Hogarth Rivwerview Manor are identifying their Local Registration Authorities (LRSs) and working towards completion of this adoption activity in December 2018.

Waasegiizhig Nanaandawe'iyewigamig Aboriginal Health Access Centre (AHAC) have executed their legal agreements, completed their readiness assessment and organization setup forms and commenced working on their privacy assessment. They are completing their local registration authority (LRA) activities and a draft of their Security Assessment is expected shortly.

Following an initial engagement session in November with Pioneer Ridge in Thunder Bay, as they were identified as a third LTC facility to engage with, Pioneer Ridge expressed interest in learning more. Another meeting with them will be setup to review further advantages of Pioneer Ridge obtaining ConnectingOntario ClinicalViewer access for their LTC facility.

Wilkes Terrace LTC in Terrace Bay, as part of the North of Superior Health Care Group, is working on their client information form.

The Distrci of Kenora Home for the Ages will be engaged with the ConnectingOntario program in December and will present them the benefits of using the ClinicalViewer tool.

We are excited to announce that Mary Berglund Community Health Centre Hub in Ignace has completed all privacy readiness requirements and passed their privacy assessment for their organization. Their dedication to updating their policies and producers made the process easy for their organization to pass the assessment. They are now working on the security readiness requirements for the program.


